

Notes:

- Coloured areas are public land, except for the Trust for Nature land at Neds Corner. White areas are private freehold land. Land use outside the study area are generalised.
- Existing public land uses in Victoria are as approved or varied by government following 12 Land Conservation Council (LCC) investigations and reviews, and the Environment Conservation Council (ECC) Box-Ironbark investigation. Refer to chapter 9 for details.
- The revised system of public land use categories shown was developed in 1994; land uses from earlier LCC studies are shown in their equivalent revised public land categories.
- The Goulburn River corridor from Nagambie to the Murray, and Ovens River corridor downstream from Wangaratta, are heritage rivers.
- Numerous small parcels subject to specific or generic recommendations - some historic & cultural features reserves, community use areas, and services & utilities areas - are not able to be shown at this scale. Refer to chapters 9 and 17 or contact VEAC for specific local information.
- Land mapped as uncategorised public land includes numerous small public land parcels not subject to a specific land use category or LCC/ECC recommendation. This includes the former cities of Midura, Swan Hill, Echuca, Shepparton and Wangaratta, and the former Borough of Kerang. Most is committed to current uses.
- Public land use mapping in the River Red Gum Forests study area is derived from VEACRECS25 Crown parcel data.
- Labels reflect reserve or local names. Labels in inverted commas are informal names. Small reserves and land in some land use categories are not labelled.
- Trust for Nature land shown on this map has been purchased through the National Reserves System Program and is thus considered a Private Protected Area. It does not necessarily represent all Trust for Nature owned land in the study area.
